The extra week off for students was a bit of a setback in starting Term 1. I thank the staff for their diligence and diversity in re-organising their programs for the school term.


Whole School Strategic Directions 2021

Swimming Lessons Term 1 2021

Students from Pre-primary to Year 6 are going swimming for nine days from Monday 30 March 2020. For your child to be able to attend we need the swimming enrolment form, the attached consent form, and all monies returned by no later than Monday 15 March for classes to be organised at the pool.

The total cost is \$40.00 - (Bus and Oasis Pool Entry for 9 days)

Students are to wear their uniform to school and will get changed into their bathers at school. It is preferred that the children arrive at the swimming centre ready to swim. The children's clothes are left at school and they get changed when they return.

For swimming the children will need to bring:

Bathers

Towel

Plastic bag – (labelled with the child's name – for wet items and shoes)

Sandals or thongs (as the ground can get hot) – preferably thongs

Swimming goggles if required

T-shirts or rash shirts are permitted (only if necessary).

Please ensure all items are marked with your child's name.

Staff Development Days 2021

Dear Parents and Caregivers,

As you may already know, one of our priority areas at Belmay Primary School is Attendance and Punctuality.

It is very important that all students attend school on a consistent regular basis. We understand that children sometimes fall ill or other factors may come into play. On such occasions please notify the school asap regarding your child's absence.

The Education Department has a minimum target of 90% attendance for all school children.

Unfortunately, even if this target is achieved for the first 10 years of a child's education it would mean that by the end of year 10 they would have missed one full year of school!

We know that parents will do their best to see that children also arrive at school on time so that they can participate in Individual Learning Programs which usually commence first thing in the morning. If students are regularly late for the commencement of school it means that they are missing out on the benefits of tailor-made programs, designed at great time length and effort, by teachers in order to meet the individual needs of students. Regularly arriving late can also sometimes cause a student to become embarrassed and, as a result, in worse case scenarios, may cause students to become reluctant to attend.

At Belmay, we as a staff are very keen to support all parents and caregivers in their efforts to have their children attend school and to arrive at school on time and we would like to extend our gratitude for your support in maximising your child's learning.

Cloverdale Dental Clinic is open from 8am – 4pm Monday to Friday. We are a free service and cater for school age children/teens from Kindy & Pre-Primary from the year they turn 5 to the end of year 11, or their 17th Birthday, whichever occurs first.

We are a Bachelor of Oral Health Final year placement clinic during university semesters. An experienced tutor oversees all check-ups and procedures.

It is not compulsory to enrol with the School Dental Service. If your children are having regular dental check-ups and treatment with their private family dentist, consider withdrawing from the school service. This will enable us to service those that are unable to access private dentistry. If circumstances change, you are welcome to re-enrol at any time.

If your address has changed/changes, please call us, as we send appointments to your home address, we also require current mobile phone numbers to send out text message reminders.

Colour Blindness

Colour blindness means that a person cannot distinguish some colours or they see the colours differently to other people. Very few people who are colour blind are 'blind' to all colours.

Commonly, the colours seen differently are greens, yellows, oranges and reds. An information leaflet on colour blindness will be distributed to all year Pre-primary students in term 1.
