Chaplain's Chat ...

Welcome back to Term 4. With Term 4 comes a reminder that the end of another school year is close, and most importantly, that means that children will be transitioning into new territory in 2021. The process of preparing children for this change needs to start now. For some, 2021 will be their first time at school or high school, for others moving up a grade or to a new school can be equally overwhelming.

Parents and carers play an important role in supporting their children in managing any transition successfully. Supporting children during transition is important because research suggests that having a positive start to school promotes children's capacity to learn and make and maintain friendships, which is supportive of positive long term mental health outcomes.

The big step of starting school can be quite daunting for you and your child. Preparation is the key to alleviating some of the stress of this change. There is a lot you can do as the parent to help ease the anxiety about that all important first day at school. Some tips for all age transitions to school can be found at this link Supporting Your Child's Transition to School

The key signs your young child is having problems transitioning would be, they have no friends, or are having difficulty making friends, their conversation about school indicates they find nothing about school enjoyable. They haven't bonded with anyone, including teachers, or have a subject they enjoy and it drives them to be at school. Finally, if your child is unable to separate themselves from you and this causes them anxiety, please seek help from a school counsellor, chaplain, psychologist, their teacher or an external professional such as a psychologist if this doesn't resolve quickly.

The greatest predictor of wellbeing for a Year 7 is having a great range of friends, therefore if your child is still struggling with making friends at this age, please look at what they need to learn these vital skills. There are now a number of nest-boxes throughout your school grounds, including one for threatened Black Cockatoo species.

The school would love your assistance with observing any activity do to with the nest-boxes. An observational diary, 'Nest-box Notes', has been placed in the Administration building for all students, staff and parents. Please keep your eyes peeled during your visits to school and feel free to write down anything you see (don't forget the date)!
