#### FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK

Dear Families,

As we fast approach the end of 2021 I have been reflecting on this most eventful of years. As we navigated our way through lockdowns including new ways to teach, learn and communicate, I was constantly reminded of the ongoing support from every member of Belmay Primary school community. We rallied together and faced the adversities, taking it all in our stride but also reaching out to each other and furthering the strong partnerships that we have forged among teachers, children and families.

### **NEW EARLY CHILDHOOD CENTRE 2021**

There are many exciting developments we are excitedly planning for next year, notwithstanding a brand new early childhood centre that will be built.

The Governments new 'WA Recovery Plan' will deliver "unprecedented investment" in local infrastructure, community facilities, and job creation. The plan will create short and long-term jobs to assist the construction, manufacturing, tourism, hospitality, renewable energy, training, education, and agriculture industries.

Among the many funding initiatives announced over the past week, the government plans to allocate funding to Belmay Primary School for upgrading and refurbishment. This is a very exciting development for our school.

The new centre will facilitate two early childhood classes which will be located more centrally, adjacent to the Drama room, where the old ablution block recently demolished stood for many years. Not only will this be a contemporary design that will accommodate early years learning the new site will go a long way to facilitate teacher collaboration...which has been a primary focus on our school improvement agenda.

Min'na yoku yatta. (Everyone did well.)



We are thankful for this Noongar land on which we learn and play.

We acknowledge the Noongar people as the first caretakers of this land. We are grateful for the amazing care they have taken of this land.

We show respect to the Elders past and present for their knowledge and expertise. We have so much to learn from them.

In this story we used the Noonga word for Emu (Weitj), Kangaroo (Yonga) and E oodjar (land/country).

How The Kangaroos Got Their Colours

In the Dreamtime, down by a sparkling waterhole Weiti the Emu sighed sadly. He was sick and tired of his dark grey feathers.

"Why do I have to be so dark and yuck?" said Weitj. Weitj thought about Yonga the Kangaroo and how white and beautiful he was. Suddenly something popped up in Weitj's head.

"I'm going to take Yonga's coat" said Weiti. "I just need to come up with a plan, a sneaky, tricky plan.

The next day Weitj held a breath holding competition between Yonga and himself. Yonga knew that Weitj is amazingly good at holding his breath but he was desperate to win. As Yonga was aiming for fifteen seconds Weitj made his move. As Weitj made a run for it Yonga popped his head out of the water, "What are you doing with that?" said Yonga. uddenly Weiti bolted through the boodjar superfast Weiti dragged Yonga's beauti<mark>fu</mark>l coat along the ground. It was now the colour of the boodjar. This is how the Kangaroo got its colour and why we have different kangaroos for different parts of the land. Red earth for the red kangaroo, and grey and brown for the Yonga that lives here on Noongar Boodjar.

The view from Parliament was amazing! When we looked through the windows we could see the flags flying and were amazed just how high Parliament House was placed over-looking the city!


Thank you very much Ms Rowe for providing us with an amazing, interesting tour around Parliament House, which we thoroughly enjoyed, and for the delicious morning tea.


