COVID SCHOOL SAFETY PROTOCOLS / OUR SCHOOL'S COVID-19 OUTBREAK RESPONSE.

COVID-19 has been confirmed.

This will initiate the Department of Education's communication and actions to confirm the case, plan the response and inform the school community accordingly. When the school administration is made aware that there is a positive case in the community, notification will be sent to staff and families using the following channels.

An initial message will be sent to staff and families through SMS and/or Connect informing them of a positive case in the school community. Please note; there is usually a delay in time from the school knowing about a case, before the Department of Health can confirm. Communication at this time may be that the case is not yet confirmed.

Once the case is confirmed, a more specific message outlining the course of action will be sent through Connect to the staff and families of those students who are deemed to be close contacts once advised by the Department of Health.

A follow up Connect post will be sent to all families based on the advice from the Department of Health to communicate the course of action taken.

A COVID-19 outbreak will result in students and staff being required to isolate. This might include one or more classes, a small group of people, or the whole school. As a school, we are committed to ensure all students are safe, supported and able to continue their learning, whether at school or home.

Please continue to check this noticeboard for all CONNECT updates pertaining to our school's operating guidelines and response planning.

As an additional level of care and precaution, in order to protect our students and the wider school community from COVID 19 we request that parents no longer enter the school grounds in the morning or afternoon. We will return to the system we adopted last year were staff will walk their students to the school gate in the afternoons so that parents can collect them. Please keep in mind social distancing while waiting for your children to be delivered to you. Students should be dropped off at the school gate in the morning and make their own way to their classrooms.

These guidelines do not apply to parents of kindy or pre-primary children.
