CHOOSE RESPECT

Dear Families,

Firstly I would like to start by thanking all families for fitting in so well with the need to wear masks in and around the school grounds.

I think we all realise this is a different lifestyle, but also very necessary.

To date we have had a steady stream of students who have contracted Covid or have had a family member test positive and have therefore had to stay home and isolate.

As a community, I look forward to the days when we are mask-free again. In the meantime, thank you for being so understanding.

We value and need your ongoing support to keep your children safe.

I would encourage all families with an unwell child to keep them home and preferably have a Rapid Antigen Test (RAT).

Quarantine and isolation (healthywa.wa.gov.au)

Under current settings, students who have no symptoms **who are close contacts** or if you as parents feel they may be close contacts (other than those who are household close contacts) must take a PCR test or a RAT within 24 hours of becoming a close contact.

Provided the test is negative, and the child has no symptoms, they may:

- continue attending school;
- attend before school care or after school care;
- attend school-based sporting or cultural training, practise, or events organised through the school and held immediately before or after school at their school; and
- travel between the student's usual place of residence and their school.

Q. My child is a close contact. Do I need to isolate with my child?

No. Only close contacts of a positive case need to isolate. However parents, carers or guardians of close contacts need to take extra precautions and limit interaction with the person who is a close contact where possible. It is important to monitor for symptoms. If you experience symptoms consistent with COVID-19, you should get tested immediately. Your child can continue going to school or childcare if they are a close contact, other than a household close contact, and have no symptoms.

Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) 2022: 10-20 May is an annual assessment for students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9. NAPLAN tests skills that are essential for every child to progress through school and life. With the test results, teachers can tailor each child's education more effectively.

NAPLAN is made up of tests in the four areas of:

- reading
- writing
- language conventions (spelling, grammar and punctuation)
- numeracy

The best way to support your child is to encourage them to do the best they can. The results of their assessment will help their teacher provide tailored learning for them. Here are some things you can do:

- Tell them that answering questions online will enable them to better show their ability.
- Let them know they will use a device with which they are familiar.
- Show your child how to write and edit using a computer and encourage them to practise using it. Word processing makes it easier to move words around and to replace and delete them.
- Let them know they will be able to go back and change most answers. (Questions that provide an online calculator cannot be changed)
